Our preschool is now complete, and we are in the final stage before opening, awaiting the completion of our road entry works with Transport for NSW to ensure safe and compliant access for all families.

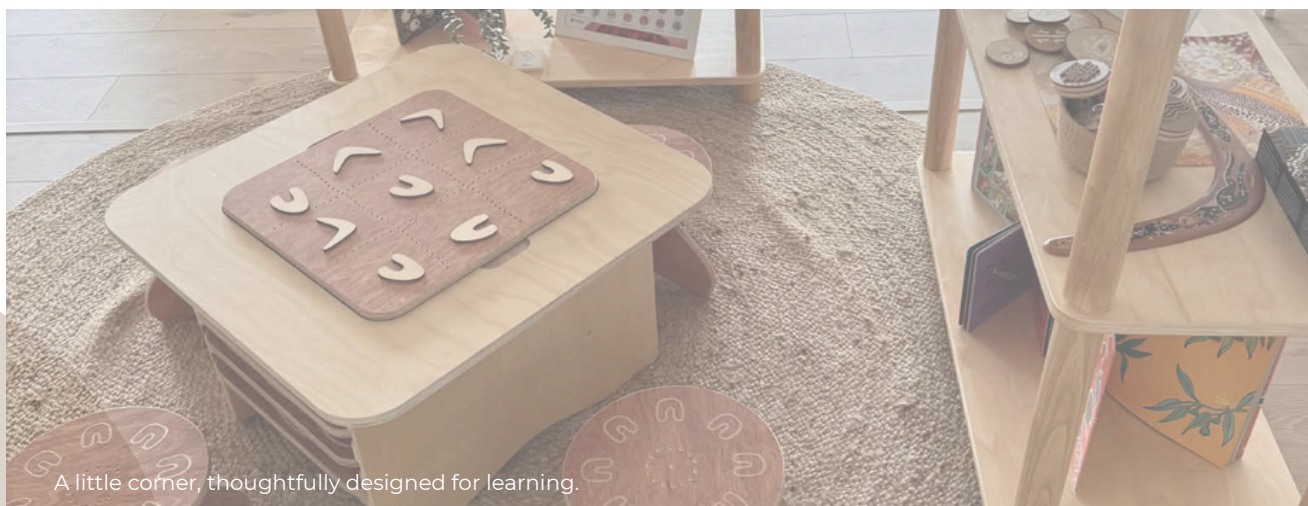

WHY REPETITION MATTERS

You may have noticed your child asking for the same book, game or routine again and again. While it can feel repetitive, it's actually an important part of how children learn.

Repetition helps children build confidence, understanding and a sense of security. Through familiar experiences, they begin to make connections, develop language and feel more in control of their world.

It also supports emotional wellbeing, helping children feel calm, safe and settled, especially during times of change.

At Miss Parker's Preschool, we intentionally use repetition through routines, songs and learning experiences to support each child's development.

Next time your child asks for "that one again," know that they are learning, growing and building confidence each time.

AT HOME GAME:

"I WENT TO THE SUPERMARKET"

A fun memory and language game using repetition

What you need:

Just your voice and imagination

How to play:

Start by saying:

"I went to the supermarket and bought a..."

Add one item (e.g. apple)

Your child repeats the sentence and adds another item

Keep going, repeating the full sentence each time and adding one more item

Why this works:

This game builds memory, language, sequencing and confidence, all through fun and repetition
